#### PREPARING FOR THE 2017-2018 SCHOOL YEAR

#### 17-18 SCHOOL CALENDAR

The school calendar for 17-18, as well as 18-19, are being finalized. The calendars will be available to all families in early to mid-February.

#### STUDENT SCHEDULING & NEW COURSE REGISTRATION PROCEDURES.

As Providence Catholic continues our efforts to go paperless, students will be registering for next-year's classes through the Student Portal. Counselors will meet with students in their English classes to guide them through the self-registration process using their devices to access the Student Portal on our Portal Plus system. Following your student's registration, parents will view, approve, and submit course selections electronically through the Parent Plus Portal. Parents will be emailed specific and detailed instructions during the week of registration.

#### **FINANCIAL AID**

Fr. McGrath's letter regarding financial aid for the 17-18 school year was sent to all families in December. A copy of his letter is available at the <u>end of this newsletter</u>, as well as on our website by <u>clicking here</u>. Please read this letter carefully. Families are encouraged to file their income tax early to meet the deadline. This <u>online</u> form is <u>very important</u>. Both the Providence Endowment Aid and the Joliet Diocesan Aid program use this form to determine the amount of Providence Catholic tuition grants for the next school year.

#### **PRE-PAYMENT RESERVATIONS**

For students who will be sophomores, juniors or seniors in the next school year, the **pre-payment reservation deadline is Thursday, January 18, 2017.** Parents of all students must return the Pre-Payment **form** with a down payment of \$100 per student by **January 18<sup>th</sup>**, to be assured of a place at Providence Catholic next year. The \$100 pre-payment is applied toward next year's tuition. We ask that the form be returned by this date so we can begin to schedule students with accuracy for the 2017-2018 school year. Please help us keep an accurate count by making a separate check for the pre-payment for each student. Please do not include the pre-payment in your regular tuition payment. Prepay forms are included with Fr. McGrath's Financial Aid letter in this newsletter and <u>online</u>.

#### INTERNATIONAL STUDENT HOSTS NEEDED

**Hosting an international student is an incredibly rewarding experience.** American families who open their homes and hearts to high school students from a different culture understand that the benefits of hosting extend beyond their

imagination. Providence Catholic is happy to work with Educatius International as one of its international partners and is currently seeking host families for the 2017-2018 school year. Educatius students are enthusiastic about studying abroad in the USA and they are required to be proficient in English, as well as meet all admission requirements of Providence Catholic. Many of the students travel from diverse countries including Brazil, China, Turkey, Vietnam, Thailand, Norway, Italy and Germany. Parents who host through Educatius are eligible to earn a generous monthly stipend. Please consider hosting! Additional information is available in the <u>letter included in this newsletter</u>.

#### PROVIDENCE CATHOLIC POLICY: AFTER DANCE PARTIES

The second semester brings with it three dances: Sweetheart in February, Prom in April and Senior Dinner Dance in May. Providence Catholic wants to be sure that our stance on after dance parties is very clear. You may remember that last September 24<sup>th</sup>, a Saturday evening, Providence Catholic held its annual Homecoming Dance, which was attended by present students and their dates. More than 700 young men and women attended the dance which lasted from 7:30 until 10:30 PM. After the dance a party was held at the home of a Providence family who were attempting to provide musical entertainment, good food, and supervision after the dance. Although they employed professional security personnel and many parent volunteers to have appropriate supervision for the event, some Providence Catholic students chose to drink alcohol on their way to this party and others obtained alcohol while they were at the party without their hosts knowing about it. Because they became intoxicated, several students had to be picked up by their parents in person, and other parents needed to assist students who became ill. Please be assured that Providence Catholic High School does not conduct, sponsor, or support after school event parties such as this, and had no connection to the staging or holding of this party. The unfortunate outcomes of this party have been addressed by the school administration and by the families involved. Those involved in this party have agreed that no further gatherings like this one will be held for Providence Catholic students from this time forward. If you have any questions, please call Fr. #### **QUIK LUNCH PROGRAM**

Just a quick reminder concerning money deposited onto your student's ID for our Quik Lunch Program. If money is deposited online at Payforit.com, funds may not be available on your student's account for 24-48 hours. Cash or checks received in the school's Main Office in the morning should be available by lunch if dropped off by the time the bell rings at 7:50 a.m. If money is dropped off in the Main Office after the start of the school day, funds will not available until the next day. Please be sure to check your student's balance often.

#### **TUITION TAX CREDIT**

The State of Illinois has enacted legislation providing an education tax credit to persons who are residents of Illinois and the parent or legal guardian of students who qualify. For information on this tax credit, you may visit their website at <a href="https://www.revenue.state.il.us.">www.revenue.state.il.us.</a>. On the left side of the page click on forms. Once on the form page, click on individuals, current year, and choose schedule ICR. You may also contact them at 1-800-782-3336. Our Tuition Officer will be mailing a summary of payments for the 2016 tax year by January 31.

#### **STUDENTS ENROLLED IN TECHNOLOGY CLASSES:**

If your student is enrolled in a Technology course this semester, be sure to check your email box for information regarding dual credit. As you may know, Providence Catholic has partnered with Moraine Valley Community College to provide college credit to each student enrolled in a Tech Class. Students who enroll for dual credit will receive high school AND college credit for taking that class here at PCHS! All you need to do is follow the directions in the email to register online with MVCC. Dual credit enrollment will be open only from Jan. 6 through Jan. 13. (You will be billed \$44 directly from MVCC in a few weeks.) If you have any questions, contact your student's Technology teacher.

#### THEOLOGY CLASS COURSE UPDATE

The Theology Department will be making changes to textbooks for the 17-18 school year, and has already made course changes for 2<sup>nd</sup> semester. The course changes were communicated at the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> semester to the appropriate

class levels. We wanted to take this time to inform all families of the changes in this department. <u>Please see the letter included in this newsletter</u> from Fr. Rich Young, OSA, Department Chair of the Theology Department, concerning these improvements.

#### ATTENTION PARENTS OF JUNIORS: ACT WORKSHOP

We are still taking registrations for our ACT Workshop, which is offered to help students prepare for the upcoming ACT Test. The workshop is held on five consecutive Saturdays, February 25 to March 25 from 8:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. The first four Saturdays will be devoted to the four academic areas of the test (English, Mathematics, Reading, and Science Reasoning). On the fifth Saturday, an official (retired) ACT Test will be given under testing conditions. The tests will be scored and returned to the students the following Monday after the test. #### **NHS SELECTIONS**



The National Honor Society will begin the selection process for new members at the beginning of the second semester. After first semester grades are finalized, the National Honor Society moderator will post a list of students who are eligible for membership based on their grade point average. Juniors and Seniors with a cumulative GPA of 3.50 or higher will be invited to begin the application process. All interested students must attend one of the information meetings. The dates and times for these meetings will be posted along with the list of eligible students. #### 8<sup>TH</sup> GRADE PLACEMENT EXAM. SATURDAY. 1/14/17

ARRIVE BY 7:45 A.M.: TEST BEGINS AT 8:00 A.M.

All current 8<sup>th</sup> graders who would like to be considered for admission to Providence Catholic as freshmen in the fall of 2017 must take this exam on Saturday, January 14, 2017. Below is important information about this day:

- Students should arrive through Door #4 by 7:45 a.m.
- The test fee is \$25.00. Cash and check (made payable to PCHS, are accepted.)
- Please bring two #2 pencils.
- Calculators are not permitted for the test.
- If you are a Providence Catholic family and have an 8<sup>th</sup> grade student, they must take the placement day on this day to be considered for admission.

#### **NEW Scholarship Opportunities for the Class of 2021!**

Providence Catholic has implemented a new academic scholarship program that will tremendously impact the incoming freshman (Class of 2021). By taking the placement exam on January 14, 2017, your student may qualify for the following scholarships. Below is a breakdown of the scholarship awards based on where your student scores on the placement exam:

**Celtic Scholar Award:** Score 90%-94% = \$6,000 (\$1,500 per year at PCHS). Must maintain a 3.25 GPA.

Celtic Scholar with Distinction Award: Score 95%-99% = \$10,000 (\$2,500 per year at PCHS). Must maintain a 3.5 GPA.

We want to thank parents, students, and alumni for spreading the word about the placement exam and Providence Catholic. Your efforts have a huge effect on persuading eighth graders and their families that our value laden environment is the answer to their needs. 

#### **BAD WEATHER POLICIES & ARRANGEMENTS**

All parents are aware that freezing temperatures may be dangerous to students who must wait in the cold. It is up to the **individual** parent to determine if their student's health is at risk when the cold is intense. **School will always be held at Providence Catholic when extremely cold temperature is the only hazard to traveling.** When there is snow on the ground, or it is snowing, or there is a threat of snow, and Providence Catholic decides to close school we will use the Notify system. If a snow schedule is in effect, school will begin **one hour later** and the buses will run **one hour later** to allow snowplows to open roads. This will be conveyed through the Notify system. School will be in session whenever the school buses can run safely. The Notify system will be the main method of notifying school closings or emergency notifications, but you may also do any of the following. First, call the PCHS Emergency Closing line at 815-717-3131. Second, listen to any of the following radio stations: WMAQ 67 (AM), WGN 720 (AM), WLS 890 (AM), B 96 (FM), WLS 94.7 (FM), WBBM 78 (AM), and locally WJOL 1340 (AM). Third, check the PCHS Website and all official Providence Catholic social media pages.

Families applying for financial aid will need to complete an **online application** and submit the necessary supporting documentation to FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment by March 1, 2017. Applicants can apply online beginning January 1, 2017, at factstuitionaid.com.

PASTORAL DEPARTMENT

Dear Parent of a Junior, Sophomore or Freshman student,

The Pastoral Department has planned an all-school retreat on **Thursday, February 23rd**. The freshmen and sophomores will stay on campus at Providence, while the juniors will be transported to St. Bernard Church in Homer Glen, IL for their retreat. There are quite a few details to coordinate with such a plan; this letter serves to inform you of the structure of the day and to seek your prayerful support.

- The bus schedule for the morning will be as usual for the normal school day. Our retreat day begins the same time as school, 7:55 a.m.
- All students will report to their 1st period classrooms for the start of the day. After the community prayer, the freshmen and sophomores will begin their retreat, while the juniors will board buses for St. Bernard Church (143rd Street and Bell Road). Fr. Terry Deffenbaugh, O.S.A. will direct the junior retreat, with the assistance of senior leaders and faculty supervisors.
- The theme of the freshman and sophomore retreat is "The Eucharist." Their schedule will include an opening prayer and introduction to the day, presentations, small group activities and a Mass. The day will include a lunch and will conclude by 12:30 p.m. Those students who take the bus to school will be returned home by bus immediately following the retreat. If you drive your student to school, you may pick him/her up after 12:30 p.m.
- The juniors will arrive at St. Bernard's by 8:30 a.m.; lunch will be provided at the parish. They will be dismissed between 1:30 and 2:00 p.m. and will return to Providence via the buses. For liability reasons, juniors must take the school buses and may not drive to St. Bernard's. (If your junior student takes a regular Providence bus to school, the Pastoral Office will contact you and make arrangements for your student's transportation home at the end of the day).

The dress code for the day will be casual, but modest. Also, all students will be provided with a lunch.

Please remember that this retreat day is mandatory, a requirement for the successful completion of this school year and progression into the next one. If your student misses this retreat for any reason (including illness), s/he will be required to make up this obligation by attending another retreat approved by the Pastoral Department. Your student may have to attend either a weekend retreat or a retreat this summer if s/he misses this retreat!

You may be tempted to ask why a retreat is an obligation. A retreat is an opportunity to experience faith on a more personal level and on a level different than "book knowledge." It allows for a "retreat" from the typical academic day and can provide a profound spiritual experience, increase self-knowledge and deepen the relationship among members of each class. The most important things we learn in life are faith, hope and love. This is why we make it mandatory for all students to attend a retreat---not just for their increased theological understanding of life, but for a faith experience with the Lord. Let us all work together toward that end.

Dear parents and guardians,

As the Chair of the Theology Department, I want to thank you for your trust in giving your child over to our care, and to assure you that the theology faculty and I take your child's intellectual and faith formation very seriously. With that in mind, I am writing this to inform you of forthcoming textbook changes beginning next academic year as well as some changes in our course sequence beginning the second semester of this year.

First of all, beginning next year (2017-2018), we will replace our present textbooks and publisher (Ave Maria Press) with a new textbook series from St. Mary Press. Most of the present texts have been in use an average of five years. Many of the editions are on the verge of changing or being discontinued. This presents us with an opportunity to consider how best we can serve you – from an academic/formation perspective as well as a financial perspective. With the new textbooks, you can purchase printed books as well as eBooks and iBooks. More information regarding text options and cost will be forthcoming during registration for next year.

Secondly, we will be changing the sequence of our classes in order to allow your child to choose from various electives in his or her senior year. This requires us to return *Introduction to Catholicism* to its original one semester status. We believe that this change enhances the theological education of our students in that they will be able to learn a new subject as well as integrate what they have learned in their Theology classes. I want to make clear that this change does not result in any gaps in the students' theological formation nor negatively impact our following of the US Bishops' *Doctrinal Elements of a Curriculum Framework for the Development of Catechetical Materials for Young People of High School Age*.

We will begin our transition to the new sequence beginning the second semester of this academic year (2016-2017). Our first-year students will participate in the study of the Old Testament. This replaces the previous second part of the *Introduction to Catholicism* class. Know that we will still be providing instruction in *Theology of the Body* as well as the life and select works of St. Augustine. I assure you of our commitment in providing a solid groundwork this first year, a groundwork on which our other classes are built.

The practical results of this transition are as follows:

- 1. We are asking present sophomores to turn their Old Testament textbooks into their teacher at the end of this semester. They would not be able to sell them even if we maintained this publisher and series as this text is going out of print.
- 2. The present freshman students will be able to use the used Old Testament books this next semester without having to purchase them.
- 3. We will be using the *Anselm Academic Study Bible* (hard cover) beginning next year. This Bible will be the primary text for the Old Testament and New Testament courses (2<sup>nd</sup> semester freshman Old Testament and 1<sup>st</sup> semester sophomore New Testament). We are also purchasing approximately 80 classroom copies of a supplemental text (*The Bible*) from St. Mary Press in order to facilitate the transition and to augment our resources for the benefit of our students.
- 4. Present students will be allowed to continue to use *The Catholic Youth Bible* from Ave Maria Press. However, they will not be able to sell them used to any incoming students. Beginning with the class of 2021, the *Anselm Academic Study Bible* will be the standard Bible for our theology classes.
- 5. The sequencing transition will affect our present sophomore class in that we will not be able to offer electives their senior year so that they can complete the courses required by the US Catholic Bishops.

I believe that I can speak for the teachers of the Theology Department by saying that we look forward to continuing working with you in the faith formation and theological education of your child.
