A Letter from the Principal

Dear Providence Catholic Community:

The 2015-2016 school year has come to a close and I feel extremely blessed to be part of the Providence Catholic family. It has been an eventful year with numerous achievements by our students who have raised the bar for excellence in academics, athletics, activities and acts

Members of the Class of 2016 have been outstanding role models to the younger peers and committed to excellence in the classroom. These seniors earned scholarships valued at nearly \$30 million. Forty-three (18 percent) members of this class were named Illinois State Scholars and thirty-six (15 percent) of these student-athletes signed National Letters of Intent or made commitments to continue their respective sports at the collegiate level.

Colin Brankin '16 (Orland Park) was named a National Merit Finalist and Patrick Connelly '16 (Tinley Park) was named a Commended Student. These prestigious honors are bestowed upon the best and brightest students in the country. These young men were also our Valedictorian and Salutatorian (see page 3 for graduation story).

Celtic teams brought home four more state trophies; the cheerleading and hockey teams placed 2nd, the wrestling team 4th and the baseball team earned their third consecutive state title. In addition, the hockey team won the CCL Kennedy Cup and the Winter Guard placed 3rd at the Midwest Color Guard Circuit. Collectively, the Celtics now boast an impressive 30 state titles, more than any other private or parochial school in Illinois. Through it all, our student-athletes demonstrate good sportsmanship, fair play and hard work, which are the true measurements of success in or out of the athletic arena.

Underlying every academic and athletic achievement at PCHS is the Catholic faith, the cornerstone of everything that takes place at the school. Students live out their faith in part by serving others and in the process, learn that "service is not an obligation, but a valued choice," as stated by a recent graduate. Collectively, students completed more than 100,000 hours of service to the school, the Church and local communities. In addition, the school's largest student organization, the Augustinian Youth Ministry (AYM) has more than 400 members that help others through various service projects (eg. food, toy, blood drives).

Although, the above-mentioned highlights have great significance, it was the act of love, compassion, unity and faith that made me most proud and humbled to be part of this incredible community. These heart-warming acts were exemplified when we lost a member of the Providence Catholic family in early May. The sudden and unexpected passing of Charlie Dunne '18 united all PCHS family members together to show our love and support for one another. We ask that you continue to keep Charlie's memory alive and keep the Dunne family in your thoughts and prayers (see memorial on page 23).


CONGRATULATIONS CLASS OF 2016 GRADUATES

PCHS celebrated the Class of 2016 Scholastic Athlete Award. Fr. John commencement in early June at the Rialto Square Theatre in Joliet. Each of the 234 members of the class crossed the Rialto stage to receive their PCHS diploma, marking the completion of four successful and memorable years.

During the ceremony, Valedictorian Colin Brankin (Orland Park) and Salutatorian Patrick Connelly (Tinley Park) addressed their classmates with powerful words of encouragement and expressed their gratefulness to family, friends and Providence faculty and staff.

One-hundred percent of the Class of 2016 will continue their education at a college or university. Approximately 746 scholarships valued at nearly \$30 million were offered to this class. Forty-three of these graduates were named Illinois State Scholars. These seniors volunteered in excess of 100,000 hours of community service during their high school careers. Twenty-eight percent of studentathletes signed National Letters of Intent or made commitments to continue their respective sports at the collegiate level. In addition, this class witnessed many athletic accomplishments, including five state championship trophies earned by the Celtic baseball teams (2014, 2015, 2016), football team (2014) and cheerleading team (2013).

Providence Catholic's varsity Celtic baseball team earned their third consecutive IHSA Class 4A State Championship Title on June 11 at Silver Cross Field in Joliet. The Celtics rallied past the Mundelein Mustangs 10-3 in front of a crowd of nearly 4,000; finishing their season 33-9. This is the first time in Illinois high school history that a varsity baseball team has achieved a three-peat. This win brings the Providence Catholic Celtics to



FRANKLIN PARKER '92

The Honorable Franklin R. Parker assumed the duties of assistant secretary of the Navy (Manpower and Reserve Affairs) in January 2016, following his confirmation by the Senate. In this capacity, he is responsible for matters pertaining to manpower and personnel policy within the Department of the Navy (DoN), including issues affecting Active and Reserve Component Sailors and Marines, and DoN civilians.

Prior to this appointment, Parker served as chief counsel for the U.S. Department of Transportation's Maritime Administration (MARAD). As chief counsel, Parker was the third-ranking official and chief legal authority. He directed and supervised the Office of Chief Counsel, which provides legal advice and services to all programs and operations in support of MARAD's mission of promoting the development and maintenance of

the U.S. Merchant Marine, and to ensuring that the United States maintains adequate shipbuilding and repair services, efficient ports, effective intermodal transportation systems and reserve shipping capacity for use in times of national emergency.

Parker joined MARAD from the Department of the Navy, where he served as special assistant to the General Counsel from August 2009 to February 2012. For his work,

Parker received the Department's Meritorious Public Service Award in 2011 and its Distinguished Public Service Award in 2012.

Prior to this service, Parker practiced law at three major national firms. He is a graduate of Yale University, Stanford Law School and Harvard

University's John F. Kennedy School of Government.

"I believe strongly in the importance and value of public service as well as supporting the dedication and sacrifice our military service members display every day," said Parker.

When asked what role Providence Catholic played in his career choices, he stated, "The academic education I received at Providence set the stage for my subsequent pursuits, preparing me well for my next steps in college and beyond. The moral and ethical instruction I received and examples displayed by faculty and staff, provided me a framework to consider many of the difficult choices we have to make in life; a framework rooted in the values of compassion, service, and respect for others."


