ROAD TO REALITY COMING TO PCHS: WEDNESDAY, 10/4

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention website reports, "alcohol is the most commonly used and abused drug among youth in the United States." The consequences of underage drinking are all-encompassing, impacting family, school, and the local community. Logically, any initiative to reduce or eliminate the alarming trend of teen alcohol abuse must also be far-reaching, promoting a partnership between parents, school officials, and municipal and village leaders. Providence Catholic has entered into such partnership with local and county wide groups to bring **Road to Reality** to PCHS on Wednesday, October 4th from 6:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m.

Biennially, the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) anonymously surveys students enrolled in grades 8, 10, and 12 as a way of gathering and tracking reliable data on substance abuse patterns among teens. The ISBE has published the general statewide results in a report known as, the Illinois Youth Survey (IYS), along with a customized school report detailing how our own Providence Catholic High School (PCHS) students responded to the survey. **IYS 2016 PCHS results** indicate that 59% of our 10th graders and 84% of our 12th graders admit to using alcohol within the past year, while 23% and 36% of 10th and 12th graders respectively report using alcohol within 30-days of completing the survey.

The administration and faculty of Providence Catholic High School are committed to combating this alarming rate of student alcohol abuse, by reshaping their view of reality. **Road to Reality** is a powerful and compelling program illustrating the potentially horrifying consequences of underage drinking and drunk driving. Relatively small groups of 15-20 students, and parents will be escorted along the **Road to Reality**, six carefully scripted scenes depicting the decisions made and consequences of, under-age drinking. By design, the program is intense, suitable for high school students and their parents. While some middle school students may be mature enough to handle the content, we do not recommend it for any child under twelve years of age.

STUDENT ACCIDENT INSURANCE

Once school begins, students are covered by the Christian Brothers Services Student Accident Plan that is designed to act as a SECONDARY/ADDITIONAL plan to your family's primary accident and medical insurance coverage. Please remember, you are responsible as the primary payer to any doctor who treats your student. Providence Catholic is not responsible for any medical costs, even if treatment is recommended by a Providence faculty or staff member. If your student is injured at school, the supervising adult is required to complete a claim within 24 hours of the accident. These forms are mailed to parents. QUIKLUNCH: CAFETERIA PAYMENT PROGRAM

We are pleased to continue to offer students a more convenient method of payment in the cafeteria. In addition to paying with cash, students can also use their Providence Catholic School ID card to pay for breakfast and lunch items.

Parents can manage their child's meal account via the web using <u>PayForlt.net</u>. With PayForlt, parents can log in at any time to make a deposit to their child's account, view their child's account balance, set up recurring deposits to their child's account, set up e-mail notifications when their child's account falls below a certain dollar amount, or request a report showing what the child has purchased on their account. Parents can add money onto an account online, or drop off a check in the Main Office.

Representatives from our Food Service Department will be on hand in the cafeteria during Meet the Teacher Night on Wednesday, August 30th to answer any questions, as well as collect cash or check payments for accounts.



The Harvest Drive is the only mandatory student fundraiser and begins on Monday, August 28th. Information concerning this year's Harvest Drive is included at the end of this newsletter. Every Providence Catholic family has a fundraising obligation of \$350 per student, or \$500 per family with two or more children at PCHS. Students who exceed their obligation by a minimum of \$100 will earn tuition credit or gift card prizes. Top-selling students and families will also earn up to \$5,000 in tuition credit. Students who do not raise their fundraising obligation will have the difference between their required quota and the amount they raised added to their tuition statement in November. This difference must be paid immediately, and cannot be spread out over the remaining tuition payments. Details for Harvest Drive 2017 are included in this newsletter. HISTORY

The Fall Harvest Drive was initiated in 1968 to raise funds for Providence, which was facing a serious financial crisis. In an effort to prevent Providence from closing its doors, the school held a car raffle and carnival that generated \$15,000 the first year and \$32,000 the following year. Encouraged by the results of this fundraising effort, the Joliet Diocese decided to keep the doors open. Since then, the Fall Harvest Drive has become an annual event, which enables Providence Catholic to keep its tuition competitive with other private schools in the area. Students raised more than \$366,000 last year.

PURPOSE

The Fall Harvest Drive is a MANDATORY student fundraiser that involves the participation of the entire Providence Catholic community. Income generated through the Harvest Drive is vital to the financial stability of the school; proceeds are built directly into the school's operating budget. Thanks to the support from the local community and area businesses, Providence is able to keep tuition increases at a minimum and still provide an outstanding college preparatory education to its students.

Each student is required to raise a minimum D of \$350, while families with two or more students at Providence are required to raise a minimum of \$500. Each family will receive raffle tickets worth their required quota (\$10 per ticket). These tickets along with a reference guide will be distributed to students on Monday, August 28. Students may reach their mandatory fundraising quota by selling raffle tickets and/or selling advertisement listing(s) that will appear in the Harvest Drive E-Directory via the PCHS website. All unsold raffle tickets must be returned to avoid additional charges. This year's Drive begins on Monday, August 28 and concludes on Friday, September 22. Student Incentives

Student/Family Prizes will be awarded to those who go above and beyond! Prizes will be awarded to the top-five students with the highest sales and the top-five families with the highest sales. In addition, all students/families that exceed their quota by at least \$100 will be eligible to receive tuition credit or gift card incentives up to \$500.

All prizes* are listed on the Harvest Drive web page.

Top seller prizes are capped at \$5,000 and will be awarded in the form of tuition credit. If a student/family's account is paid in full, they will receive a credit to their tuition account, but may request a check from the tuition office for any overage.

All money must be received by 9 a.m. on Wednesday, September 20 to qualify for student prizes. However, late money will be accepted for advertisement listings through October 31 and applied toward the student's quota. Late money will not be considered when determining student prizes.

E-Directory

To purchase an advertisement listing, patrons must complete the Platinum, Gold or Bronze Level form online. It is imperative to follow all directions to ensure the listing appears correctly in the E-Directory. Online payments are preferred, however, checks payable to "PCHS" will also be accepted. No cash please. Ad listings will not be processed until payment is received.

Be sure to give businesses ample time for advertising authorization so they are able to purchase their advertisement by 9 a.m. on Wednesday, September 20.

Ad listings will be posted on the PCHS website via the Harvest Drive E-Directory in early November. The listings will follow a new and improved format similar to other online directories (select link below for sample). Students may also sell ad listings to family and friends who would like to convey a personal message; these ads will be placed in the "Family/Happy Ads" category of the E-Directory.


