#### ROAD TO REALITY: WEDNESDAY, 10/4

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention website reports, "alcohol is the most commonly used and abused drug among youth in the United States." The consequences of underage drinking are all-encompassing, impacting family, school, and the local community. Logically, any initiative to reduce or eliminate the alarming trend of teen alcohol abuse must also be far-reaching, promoting a partnership between parents, school officials, and municipal and village leaders. Providence Catholic has entered such partnership with local and county wide groups to bring Road to Reality to PCHS on

Wednesday, October 4th from 6:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m.

Biannually, the Illinois State Board of Education (ISBE) anonymously surveys students enrolled in grades 8, 10, and 12 as a way of gathering and tracking reliable data on substance abuse patterns among teens. The ISBE has published the general statewide results in a report known as, the Illinois Youth Survey (IYS), along with a customized school report detailing how our own Providence Catholic High School (PCHS) students responded to the survey. **IYS 2016 PCHS results** indicate that 59% of our 10<sup>th</sup> graders and 84% of our 12<sup>th</sup> graders admit to using alcohol within the past year, while 23% and 36% of 10<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders respectively report using alcohol within 30-days of completing the survey.

The administration and faculty of Providence Catholic High School are committed to combating this alarming rate of student alcohol abuse, by reshaping their view of reality. **Road to Reality** is a powerful and compelling program illustrating the potentially horrifying consequences of underage drinking and drunk driving. Groups of students, parents and community members will be escorted along the **Road to Reality**, six scenes depicting the decisions made and consequences of, under-age drinking. By design, the program is intense, suitable for high school students and their parents. While some middle school students may be mature enough to handle the content, we do not recommend it for any child under ten years of age.

An informational flyer is included at the end of this newsletter. PCHS students who attend will receive a special dress down day, as well as extra credit in their English class.

<u>Secretary of State Display:</u> During Homecoming Week, the Counseling Department and Student Assistance Team have arranged to have a tabletop display at Providence Catholic that speaks to the negative consequences of driving under the influence. It displays true stories with photos and quotes from victims. It also summarizes the zero tolerance laws for those drivers under the age of 21.

- o The Cambridge Prep Test 10 will be given to our Freshmen and Sophomores. This test resembles the ACT and is designed for 9th and 10th graders. Lunch will not be served on this day.

Red Ribbon Week is October 23 – 27, 2017. The Red Ribbon Campaign began in 1985 as a response to the torture and death of federal drug enforcement agent, Enrique Camarena. Wearing and displaying red ribbons are signs that you are against the promotion, sale, purchase and use of illegal drugs or any drug used in an illegal or unhealthy way. This includes the use of alcohol by anyone under the age of 21.

Many departments, clubs and organizations come together to promote this week throughout the Providence Catholic Community. Events for the week include:


