NATIONAL COMMENDED STUDENTS

Mr. Paul Houston, Principal of Providence Catholic High School, is pleased to announce that seniors Zinn Amos, Andrew Dau, and Elizabeth Kulpinski (pictured below) have been named Commended Students in the 2022 National Merit Scholarship Program. "We are extremely proud of these students and their academic success in this highly competitive program," said Houston. "They have put in a great amount of work on their studies, and we congratulate them on this achievement."



The National Merit Scholarship Program is an annual academic competition for recognition and college undergraduate scholarships that began in 1955. More than 1.5 million students enter the National Merit Scholarship Program each year. Approximately 34,000 students are named Commended Students.

In addition, three Providence students were selected as College Board National Recognition Program awardees: Zinn Amos, National African American Recognition Award; Andrew Dau, National African American Recognition Award; and Isaac Sanchez, National Hispanic Recognition Award (pictured below).

They earned recognition for academic achievements in school combined with outstanding performance on the PSAT/NMSQT, PSAT 10, and/or AP Exams.

"They've accomplished these milestones during challenging times," says Houston. "We couldn't be more delighted to share this exceptional news. Zinn, Andrew and Isaac are each academically talented in addition to being involved, caring members of the Providence family. We are very proud of their accomplishments."



SHAREFEST

On October 23, Providence hosted ShareFest at the campus. According to Mrs. Annie Persicketti, Assistant Director of the Pastoral Office, "We had 44 pallets of food which translates into 40,000 pounds. We were able to feed 491 people. Workforce Services spoke to 225 people regarding job placement. Many individuals received a health screening from nursing students at Governors State University. And we provided a tremendous amount of clothes, books and household items to families who were in need."

Mrs. Potempa's theology class discussed the importance of relics in the Middle Ages. Mrs. Persicketti showed students the chamber in the altar where relics are kept.

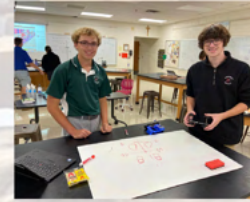

BUILDING BRIGHTER TOMORROWS

Today, there is a bigger need than ever for mental health initiatives. Providence Catholic's Counseling Department has made it a goal to bring more attention to mental health this year.

As a Catholic school, we care about the success of students not just academically - but in their overall growth and development as unique, strong individuals.

This year, the Counseling Department has thoughtfully put into place initiatives aimed at supporting mental health at Providence.

"We continue to support students academically and socially," says Mr. Luke Senffner '01, Director of the Counseling Department. "We have professional counselors available, as well as new tools to assist students. We host parent informational workshops that focus on helping parents to better understand and engage their teens."

In addition to our school/college counselors, Mr. Jeremiah Jobe '04 joins us as our full-time social worker to address the social/emotional needs of our students. "This is an incredible addition to the Providence community," says Senffner. "We've seen the effects of Covid on our students, as well as the many pressures teens face today. Mr. Jobe will focus on looking at the social emotional needs of our students and implementing ways to assist them."

The Counseling Department engages students in various ways throughout the year to help increase positive mental health while providing tools for students to use to better manage any anxieties they may be experiencing.

In September, Ms. Hamdan presented a beautiful prayer to the Celtic community to reflect upon the importance of National Suicide Prevention Day. Providence provides resources to students on the back of their school IDs – these resources are available to all students in a time of need.

Also in September, the Celtic volleyball and baseball teams raised awareness for suicide prevention. The teams put notes on every student locker at Providence and wore teal and purple for the game. The baseball team sold bracelets for which the proceeds benefit The Jason Foundation, Inc. - Youth Suicide Prevention and Awareness. The volleyball team donned purple and teal shoelaces as they played, and the Celtic Nation crowd showed their support.

"It's really about community," says Mr. Senffner. "At PC, we are a family. We look out for each other. And we will continue to find new tools to help more students. We are proud of our Celtic family and will only get better, together."

Upcoming event for Providence parents: Mindful Parenting: An educational series to help parents gain an understanding of common issues affecting teens, presented by Lotus Therapy Group on February 1, 2023.

There will be four presentations covering different topics. Current parents, alumni parents, and parents of incoming freshmen will be able to choose to attend two of the presentations.

LIVING THE MISSION

Senior Zinn Amos has a history of getting involved - and this past summer, he made a journey that paved his future path.



Over the summer, senior Zinn Amos took a two-week trip to Hué, Vietnam. This trip, however, wasn't your typical vacation; it was a medical trip for 17 to 19 year old students who have an interest in a career in medicine. Zinn spent his time there as an intern at the Hué University of Medicine and Pharmacy.

"The purpose was to give us some in-depth insight into what a medical career looks like," says Zinn. "And to give us the chance to experience live surgeries, learn from doctors in various specialties, and learn about all of the different fields of medicine."

While there, Zinn participated in daily rotations where he spent each day in two different departments of the hospital. The departments varied, and included Surgery, Internal Medicine, Family Medicine, Dentistry, Cardiology, Anesthesiology, Neurology, Traditional Medicine, and Pharmacy, in addition to others.

"In each department, I learned about the educational requirements to pursue a career in that field and spent the day interacting with patients to learn about their symptoms, the ailments they suffered from, and how the treatments that were used worked," says Zinn. "I saw live procedures and surgeries like colonoscopies, laryngoscopies, a root canal, and childbirth. Also, I received a lot

of hands-on experience as I had the opportunity to perform acupuncture and cupping, break down lemon grass and boil it to create essential oils, learn how to suture, learn how to perform intubation and CPR, and explore the anatomy of the body with a cadaver."

In his internship and in his free time, Zinn was also able to immerse himself in a completely different culture and language, try new food, learn about the vast history of Vietnam, explore the Forbidden City and the beautiful Vietnamese temples, and make friends from diverse backgrounds.

"The most important thing I learned during this trip is how incredibly different and unique the people and cultures of the world are and how important it is that we celebrate and embrace our diversity," he adds.

Some of the best moments of his trip were exploring the city at night with friends, learning some Vietnamese phrases, eating the traditional food (especially the Pho, he says), learning how to suture, and studying the cadaver. For Zinn, one of the most difficult aspects of the trip was getting accustomed to the completely different environment and language there.

"I had to re-learn how to cross the streets because of the drastically different traffic and driving there," he says. "I will

definitely plan on studying abroad again because I was able to experience a new culture while pursuing my interests and learning more about myself. I hope to use everything I learned on this trip about medicine to help me in my pursuit of a medical career. In college I plan to study Biomedical Engineering and later attend Medical School, with the ultimate goal of becoming an Orthopedic Surgeon."

"Zinn is a student leader with tremendous initiative, one who is always planning and preparing for what may come, and one who always seems to find a way to succeed and excel," says Kyle Murphy, Junior and Senior Counselor at Providence Catholic. "I would place Zinn among the top one percent of all students I have known in my 13 years in education. He is that remarkable."

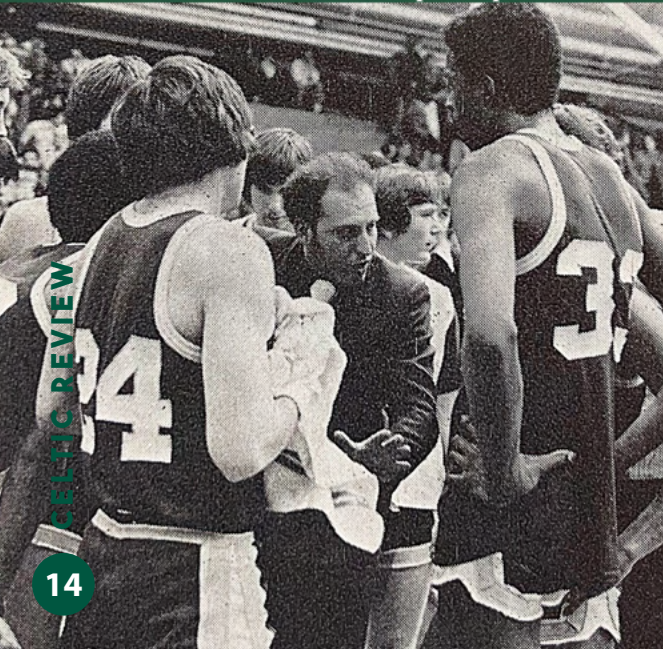
THE LEWIS PIPELINE

I mentioned in the past the link between Providence, Tom Dedin, Lewis College, and Gordie Gillespie, and the link between Lewis, myself, and how I arrived at Providence. I knew of others coming from Lewis College but I had no idea the influence was so great.

When I arrived at Lewis, the Christian Brothers had recently taken over the administration of the College. I had great respect for the Brothers and that was one reason I chose Lewis. It was a school of about 400 in the fall of 1961, with about 200 off campus students and 200 residents on campus. When we graduated in 1965, the school had doubled in size to about 800. From the late 1960s through the early 1980s, besides Tom and myself, there were at least 10 other Lewis grads that impacted Providence Catholic academically and athletically. I'm going to write about these gentlemen and their contribution here.

Tom Kennedy would spend a year at Providence assisting Tom Dedin before moving on to coach at JJC and work in college administration. What he remembers is the vitality of the staff, their energy and commitment to both teaching and coaching.

Pat McInerney became one of Matt Senffner's first paid assistants in football and one of mine in track. He then went on to start the wrestling program, and teach in the Social Studies Department. He also became the first full time dean. He later became principal at three parish schools before returning to teach again at Providence.

Mike Slovik, another Lewis grad, assisted Coach Senffner in football and taught history. He later went on to coach at the University of St. Francis and St. Xavier University in Chicago.

Don Butch Markelz played for coach Dedin and was on the 1975 National Championship team at Lewis. He earned All-Tournament and Most Valuable Player honors that year as well. Coach Markelz came back to teach, coach and became dean before moving on to Lockport.

Jim Walzak was a longtime assistant in track and football. He coached a number of state qualifiers in the field events. He later became the girls golf coach where he had the pleasure of coaching an individual state champion. He taught in the Business and Social Studies Department before retiring and moving to Texas.

Joe Rodeghero taught in the Social Studies Department and coached baseball and football. He brought baseball teams deep into the state tournament. He taught and coached at both JCA and Providence and ended his coaching career at Lemont High School.

Jamie Garcia was hired by Coach Dedin to assist in baseball. He taught Spanish and took over the baseball job after Dedin left. He also became the first Director of Development. He was an excellent coach, winning the state tournament. He coached professional baseball for nearly 30 years after leaving Providence.

Frank Palmasani followed Pat Sullivan as head basketball coach at PCHS. He started with a record of 2-22 but within a few short years he coached the 1979 state championship team. He began working in college admissions at Hinsdale South, later returning to Providence. He is a noted author, writing about the college admissions process, and is a consultant to WGN - as well as being featured in the Boston Herald and the Chicago Tribune.

The plan was for Providence to be co-institutional, but that soon changed. It was more practical to be co-educational. For a time, the Christian Brothers dropped football in their high schools but Brother Dan and Coach Dedin thought football would be an attractive option to draw young men to the once all-girls school. Matt Senffner's biology major was a good fit, so Dedin called his brother-in-law and asked him to start a program from the ground up. Senffner agreed to come to Providence and the program was born in 1966. There were 25 freshmen that year and Coach Senffner had no paid assistants, but only occasional help from two volunteers.

The following year, a coach with college experience was brought in to coach the sophomores, but he lasted only one year. In the fall of 1968, Matt Senffner was named the first varsity coach. Dedin had helped to create the South Central Prep League but there was no football competition in the league. Everyone knew the tenuous situation the school was in, but we all pressed on anyway.

Bob McAlpin, an experienced Catholic League coach, joined Coach Senffner's staff and a sophomore coach was hired as well. When Fr. Kaffer became principal, he and Coach Dedin petitioned to join the Private School League and were accepted. It became important to be in a competitive league with defined goals to work for since the IHSA didn't begin the modern state playoff program until 1974. The team won its first playoff game in the 1970s but it wasn't until the mid-1980s that the program began to really take off.

Under Senffner's guidance, the team won its first state championship in 1987 and then went on to win eight more state titles.

He led the team to a total of 26 state appearances and 300 wins making him the winningest football coach in state history at that time. He had seven nationally ranked teams, has received a number of "Man of the Year" awards, and been elected into four Halls of Fame. He also served on both the Joliet Diocese and St. Mary Nativity School Boards and the City of Joliet Planning Commission, retiring in 2006.

The final Lewis grad I'm writing about is Pat Sullivan, a Lewis classmate of mine. Sullivan first worked at Loras College. He came to Providence to teach Spanish and take over the basketball program since Dedin's responsibilities as athletic director increased upon expansion of our other athletic programs. Sullivan also coached soccer and baseball. He brought the basketball program their first winning season in 1968, highlighted by a stunning upset victory over state-ranked JCA.

His value to the school went far beyond the basketball court. He echoed Coach Dedin's belief that a coach must be an excellent teacher first, and he certainly was that. When Fr. Kaffer was named Principal, Sullivan's responsibilities expanded. He was named Harvest Drive Director and accompanied Fr. Kaffer on fundraising meetings with prospective donors. He was promoted to Assistant Principal and began to hone his motivational skills as well. One year, the basketball team lost to Chicago Christian by 40 points. After the game, Sullivan told his players that one day we will beat that team. The next year, with both teams 10 and 1, the team beat Chicago Christian and went on to be conference champions.

Sullivan taught and coached for 10 years at Providence before going to the College of St. Francis. At St. Francis, he had over 500 career wins. During one 18 year period, he led his teams to 15 first or second place finishes and advanced to the NAIA national tournament in 1994 and 1996. He believes that one of his most important accomplishments was having seen 172 of 176 of his players graduate.

He authored two books on motivation and his motivational and public speaking resume includes engagements at IBM, Nike, and Notre Dame's "Play Like A Champion Program". From 1986 -2009 he conducted basketball camps and clinics in Greece, Belgium, Austria and Ireland. He has been inducted into eight different Halls of Fame, and was named coach of the year on multiple occasions from the CCAC, NAIA District 20, NAIA Region IV and the National Basketball Tournament.

He became Athletic Director and later was appointed a special assistant to USF's President. The current indoor athletic center at USF is named for him.

I don't know what it was about Lewis and those early years at Providence. Was it the Christian Brothers? Or perhaps Gordie's influence? Maybe it was a mythological pioneer spirit or the fact that we saw and were part of Lewis as it grew and expanded? Perhaps we were just young and energetic. As Sullivan observed during the late 1960s, if the school closed we would all be out of a job, but no one mentioned that - we all just kept working. We worked together and had great students to work with. What a wonderful group and what a wonderful era.

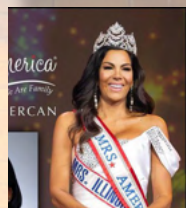
As Coach Sullivan also observed, it's amazing to look back at all the success we've had athletically beginning with a gym that had no backboards, the baseball team with no field, a track team with no track, and a wrestling team with no gym mats. It didn't bother any of us or the athletes. I have been blessed to work with so many dynamic people.

EMPOWER ILLINOIS

The Illinois Tax Credit Scholarship program provides K-12 scholarships for students in low-income and working-class families to attend a qualified private school in Illinois through a scholarship provided by private donor dollars.

Donors may make a gift up to \$1.33 million to Empower Illinois, to provide scholarships. Donors are then eligible to receive a 75 percent (\$1 million cap) state tax credit on the donation to be used against the individual or corporation’s state and local tax liability.

Different from many existing tax credit scholarship programs around the country, donors may designate their donations to specific schools or school systems. At this time, corporations can donate, but may not designate their donation.

As a result of donations, qualifying students may apply and receive scholarships worth up to 100 percent of required tuition at a private school of their choice. Last year eight income qualified students received scholarships at Providence Catholic High School. However, the demand far exceeded the supply. Unfortunately, last year 47 students remained on the wait list.
