It has been a while since my last newsletter, mostly because we have been busy with great things at Providence Catholic. The most publicized was the amazing run by our football team that was 4-4 and needed to win the last regular season game to make the playoffs. They did and then made it to the state championship game! It was a thrilling ride for our students, families, alumni, and fans, and we are incredibly proud of the players and coaches for their hard work, lofty goals, resilience, toughness, teamwork, and achievement.

At the championship game, the Men's Club and Women's Club combined for a pregame celebration in the IHSA Tent City and received the 1st place IHSA Fan Spirit Award. It was just one of many examples this year of the organization and collaboration by these groups that our Providence family has benefited from.

The other big news has been in recruitment. Thanks to our Shadow Days, Open House, and other efforts, we had 234 students take the Placement Test on December 3rd, a tremendous increase from 184 on the first test date last year. With two make-up exams completed, we have had 279 students test. I know parents of Providence students are some of our best ambassadors, and I thank you for all you've done to promote our school.

One of my goals this year was to establish an annual curriculum review cycle. The Department Chairs and I created, discussed, debated, and voted on six proposals for the 23-24 school year. It was a great process, especially for the first time, and resulted in the administration approving three new courses (including AP Computer Science Principles), a course name change, and a content change in which Calculus Honors will now focus on business applications.

To no one's surprise, our students continue to show their brilliance, creativity, and dedication in countless ways. Some recent highlights include:

- Senior Zinn Amos was named a Semifinalist in the Coca-Cola Scholars Program, one of 1,557 semifinalists from more than 90,000 applicants.
- Senior Ryan Gade completed his Eagle Scout project and the Follow Me cross has been restored and reinstalled in front of school.
- Senior Paige Shepherd has been selected to All-State Honors Choir the sixth year in a row that a Singing Celtic has gone to State.
- 46 students from the class of 2023 have been designated Illinois State Scholars.
- Theology classes collected for the Augustinian Missions and raised a total of \$3,165.94.

I am incredibly grateful to be part of the Providence community. Thank you for your welcome, your support, and most of all for the gift of your children. Have a blessed Christmas and a peaceful break.
