The first SAVI was held in April, 2010 at St. Rita of Cascia High School in Chicago, IL. The Augustinian schools in attendance included:

Villanova College—King City, Ontario

51 students represented the eight Augustinian schools for a three day experience of faith, friendship and service. The time spent together helped all students deepen their understanding of the core values of truth, unity and love and find ways to live and promote these values in their own schools. Since our beginning, two new schools have joined us: Austin Catholic in Chesterfield, MI and Austin Prep in Reading, MA.
