Integrating the Key Aspects of College Search

The Exploration Phase

ACADEMIC

- 1) Does the College have the Major or Program of Study that interests me?
- 2) What is the Quality of that Program?
- 3) Can I predict my capacity to be academically successful?

FEEL

- 1) Is the school's location suitable to my preferences?
- 2) If I'm living on campus, what is the weekend experience like?
- 3) Is the school setting (city, suburb, rural) what I'm looking for?
- 4) What is the culture like? How spiritual is the campus? What's the social life like?

FINANCIAL

- 1) Once I've assessed what I can afford, does the college's net price match that?
- 2) Even if I can afford multiple college options, is the value of one school vs. the other worth a significant increase in net price?
- 3) Am I in a financial position to eliminate this topic in my search?

The following colleges represent a ranking of net price based on the history of reviewing award letters of PCHS students who have attended in the past, or using the information posted on the colleges' net price calculators.

These are not meant to infer 100% reliability. All eventual out-of-pocket costs at schools are dependent on a series of issues, including the college's marketing efforts.

It is designed to help families compare and contrast out-of-pocket cost options.

A = colleges that offer significant sticker price reduction in their category, or whose sticker price is relatively low

B= colleges that offer modest sticker price reduction in their category

C= colleges that offer little or no sticker price reduction in their category
