## **Graduation Requirements**

Twenty-two credits are the minimum needed to graduate. Each year a student must take and pass courses worth at least 5 1/2 credits.

The requirements for the Class of 2024 include:

- 4 years of Theology
- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Mathematics
- 3 years of Social Science (including U.S. History &
- American Government)
- 3 years of Laboratory Science
- 2 years of World Language (same & consecutive)
- 1 semester of Economics or Macro-Economics
- 1 semester of Technology
- 1 year of Physical Education or Band
- 1 semester of Health
- 1 semester of Civics (included in Amer. Government)

Students must also complete a minimum of 60 service hours. (10 hours freshman year; 10 hours sophomore year, 15 hours junior year and 25 hours senior year) However, many students complete many more hours than what is required.
